Fly of the month – Woolly Bugger



This month we will tie an olive bead-head Woolly Bugger and a few other style lures. The origin of this lure is a little uncertain and has been disputed. Some think it is derived from Frank Sawyer's Woolly Worm pattern.

The Woolly Bugger is a great searching pattern for all freshwater game fish and has been produced in a wide variety of colours, but the three versions – olive, brown and black would be the most popular.

#### **Bound Shield Fly Tying Challenge for April**

Members are to tie 3 variations of a Pheasant Tail Nymph at home. The flies should be on 3 different hook sizes # 12, #14, #16 and should be variations that do not look alike. For instance, one fly may have a bead head, one a wing case, another with legs of some kind or any combination of different features. Bring your 3 flies to the Fly Tying meeting in May for judging.

lan has the distinction of winning more club trophies than any other club member and this is testament to his skill as an angler.


