### This month – Woolly Bugger



This lure is a favourite both with anglers and with trout. In larger sizes it most likely is taken as a small fish and in small sizes could represent large invertebrates.

The most popular version of this lure is the Olive Woolly Bugger but brown and black versions can be successful especially in still water.

Bound Shield Challenge for March was won by Peter Zillwood for his Scud pattern. It was hard to judge the entries this month because the other three flies entered were all very attractive and well made. However in the end it came down to this. Four entries: pick out the most Scud like and Peter's fly was chosen. The other entries were lacking the brush like legs that should cover the underside of the fly. No doubt that all the flies will catch trout.

Bound Shield Challenge for April is to tie a Goddard Caddis Pattern as in the video clip shown here.

Tie two flies of this pattern, one size 12 and one size 14 ( long shank hooks are acceptable).
